Interested in helping remove invasive species from natural areas?

Non-native invasive plants are threatening our wildlife habitat. We need YOU to help stop them! Volunteers will assist with hand-pulling and cutting invasive plants to help prevent their spread on the Refuge. Our battle plan is to pull the plants before they go to seed or drop their seed.

Dates: Wednesday, July 28th Targeted Invader: Japanese barberry*
 Wednesday, Aug 11th Targeted Invader: Japanese stiltgrass*

Time: 9am - 12pm

Location: Seatuck National Wildlife Refuge (500 St. Mark's Lane, Islip, NY 11751)

Directions: Take Exit 45 (RT 111 South/Islip Ave) towards Islip off of Sunrise Highway (Route 27). Turn left on Main St (RT 27A) and make the first right onto St Mark's Lane. The Refuge gate is at the end of the road.

Provided: Training on weed ID and removal, gloves, drinking water, snacks, insect/tick repellent and tools.

Bring/Wear: Wear long pants and long sleeved shirt (white/khaki/light gray recommended) for tick and mosquito protection, closed toed shoes, hat, sunscreen, and water bottle.
